Noted Russian Will Give Piano Program at St. Paul Tuesday

Two of Sergei Rachmaninoff's own compositions have been included in the piano program which the noted Russian pianist-composer will play at the St. Paul Auditorium Tuesday evening.

This Rachmaninoff concert is being sponsored by Edmund A. Stein, and marks the only Twin Cities appearance of this noted artist.

The two compositions by the pianist are his universally popular Prelude in C sharp minor and "Two Etudes," the latter one of his more recent compositions, to be played at the St. Paul concert for the first time in these parts.

The Beethoven sonata, opus 26, will be the major program number, Tuesday evening. It will be played in its four divisions.

The second program number is the Schumann "Etude Symphonique" to be followed by a group of three Chopin numbers.

The program concludes with the Strauss-Tausig "Valse."

Rachmaninoff is en route to the west coast where he has been engaged for a series of 20 concerts during the spring months. He last played in the Twin Cities three years ago.

Rachmaninoff is equally noted as a composer. Probably his most elaborate composition is his symphony which has been played by virtually every symphony orchestra in the country. The Minneapolis Symphony played it at one of the Friday evening concerts this season just prior to the Christmas holidays.

The seats for the Rachmaninoff concert at the St. Paul Auditorium are on sale at the Cable Piano company's downtown ticket office, Eighth and Nicollet avenue.
