

Audience Thrilled By Rachmaninoff

Pianist Delights 1,822
Listeners With Varied
Program

Sergei Rachmaninoff appeared at a recital last night in the Memorial Building and 1,822 persons listened with ecstasy as the masterful pianist went through a varied program.

And, of course, it could not have been a true Rachmaninoff program if the noted Russian did not include his own celebrated composition, "Prelude in C Sharp Minor," known to all young pianists the world over.

He played also Beethoven's "Sonata Appassionata," Liszt's "Rhapsody No. 11," his own "Humoresque" and compositions by Tausig, Bach-Liszt, Mendelssohn, Chopin and Rimsky-Korsakov.

At the close of the program the insistent applause of the audience brought the veteran recitalist back to the piano for an encore which was enthusiastically received. All in all, it was a swell concert.
