

## RACHMANINOFF TO GIVE RECITAL HERE THURSDAY NIGHT

Rachmaninoff, world famous composer-pianist, whose recital at the Scottish Rite Cathedral Thursday night is looked forward to as the musical event of the year, will arrive from San Antonio over the Southern Pacific at 7 a.m. Wednesday.

He will be located at the Rice Hotel where a concert grand has been placed in his sitting room for his use while spending two days in Houston before playing for what promises to be a capacity house.

Rachmaninoff comes here on a tour of 42 principal cities of the United States; a tour which is proving to be one musical triumph after another. Called upon to play some 400 pieces, the 63-year-old composed-conductor-pianist does not give a recital every night, but reserves time between his appearances for relaxation, study and work.

His program here includes: Organ Fantasia and Fugue in G-minor, by Bach-Liszt; Sonata No. 3, opus 10 with its four movements, presto, adagio mesto, minuet and rondo, by Beethoven; a Chopin group, Polonaise C minor, Nocturne, Mazurka and Rondo opus 16. Then after a short intermission, Rachmaninoff will play his own composition, Three Etudes: Tableaux, opus 33, G minor, E flat and E flat major, followed by Liszt's Sonnetto del Patrarca No. 2, Magic Fire, by Wagner-Brassin, and two Paganini-Liszt Etudes, E flat major and E minor.
