

SERGIE RACHMANINOFF COMING TO SEATTLE ON FEBRUARY 25

Famous Russian Composer and Pianist Will Give Recital at Metropolitan Theater

The famous Russian composer and pianist, Sergei Rachmaninoff, who will be presented at the Metropolitan theater, in concert, Wednesday evening, February 25, is one of the few men now before the public who combines the technique of a virtuoso with genuine musicianship, individuality and poetic sensibility. His style of playing is absolutely his own. Alive with color, with expressive nuance, with dynamic rhythmical modulations and graduations of tone, it brings vividly to the surface the emotional substance of each piece of music. In fact, it marks the pin-

nacle of artistic musicianship at the piano with a master hand on the keyboard. Rachmaninoff cannot be measured by the canons by which musicians generally are classed. His personality dominates his work thruout, making it distinctive and distinct. To talk of technique and standards in connections with such outstanding qualities as distinguish the work of this wonderful player and composer would be presumption.
