

RACHMANINOFF PROGRAM TOLD

Presenting one of the best known concert artists of the present day, noted both for his pianistic art and for his compositions, Peter D. Conley introduces Sergei Rachmaninoff tomorrow night as the final attraction on his series at the Oakland Auditorium Theater.

Known as the "romantic conservative" among pianists, Russia's great artist has arranged a program exactly expressive of his taste. He will play the following:

Variations, C minor by Beethoven; Nachstück, opus 23 by Schumann; Impromptu, F minor by Schubert; Invitation to the Dance by Weber-Tausig; Scherzo from Midsummer Night's Dream by Mendelssohn; Three preludes by Rachmaninoff, (a) Sonnetto del Petrarca, (b) Etude, (c) Rhapsodie by Liszt.
