Rachmaninoff To Play Today

RACHMANINOFF, today at 4 o'clock, at Constitution Hall, will be heard in the first piano recital the distinguished Russian composer-pianist has given in Washington in two years. presented by Mrs. Dorothy Hodgkin Dorsey in her Sunday afternoon series. The world-famous pianist only recently appeared with the Philadelphia Orchestra here in what proved one of the outstanding events of the current music season.

Rachmaninoff's recital this afternoon also marks the first time this noted artist has ever been presented at a popular-priced scale. Today the box office at Constitution Hall will be open at 10 o'clock, remaining open until after the concert begins.

Chopin, Beethoven and Weber constitute his program. No less than seven Chopin compositions make up the first half of his program. He will play the Impromptu, the first Scherzo, two Mazurkas, the Tarantella, Nocturne, and the fourth Ballade. Following the intermission Mr. Rachmaninoff will play the Beethoven "Sonata Appassionata," opus 57, and then Tausig's setting of Weber's "Invitation to the Dance." From his encore repertory one may expect to hear the artist also as composer.
