

RACHMANINOFF'S RECITAL.

Great Pianist Will Be Heard at New Haven Friday Evening.

Rachmaninoff, who will appear at Woolsey Hall, New Haven, on Friday evening, Jan. 14, at 8.15, like many of the great composers, first won fame as

a soloist. His present tour is, therefore, of special interest as it will serve to present more intimately his genius to a great and increasing number of American admirers.

Rachmaninoff is now in his early forties, and at the height of his powers. Not only is he justly regarded as one of the foremost living composers; his magnificent playing stamps him as a truly great pianist as well.
