

RACHMANINOFF IN NOV. 11 RECITAL

Composer's Program on Armistice Day Promises Music Feast

Armistice day will be celebrated in a most fitting way at the university armory with Rachmaninoff's recital of representative works, including compositions of Mozart, Schumann, Chopin, Liszt and Rachmaninoff himself. This recital will be the second of the university concert course series. Those who appreciate good music, as well as students of music, owe a debt of gratitude to those who planned this splendid series early in the fall.

Sergei Rachmaninoff's name is sufficient to thrill lovers of music. His prelude in C minor is known to every music student, and perhaps in lesser degree, his "Island of Death" (inspired by Boecklin's picture), recently exhibited at the state fair, and Prelude in G Minor. He is known first as a composer, and then as a pianist of first rank. His compositions include symphonies, concertos, many songs, choruses and pieces for chamber music; in addition he has written three operas, "Aleko," "The Niggardly Knight" and "Francesco da Rimini." In memory of Tschaikowsky, he composed the "Elegiac Trio."

His program next Friday does not include as many of his compositions as his admirers may wish, but it will be remembered that the famous musician is not niggardly with his encores. The program has just been announced as follows:
