Whether Rachmaninoff ranks higher as a pianist or as a composer, is a subject of some controversy among critics, but all agree in placing him among the foremost in both these lines of musical endeavor. Bridgeport will have an opportunity for forming its own conclusions on this matter when the great Russian artist appears at Poli's theatre next Sunday afternoon as two of his own compositions, "Prelude in C-Sharp Minor" and "Polka de W. R." are on the program.
