

PLAYS OWN COMPOSITIONS

Rachmaninoff, Foremost of Composers, Here Tonight.

Sergei Rachmaninoff, who is considered by many critics the greatest living composer and also one of the greatest pianists, will give a recital in the Auditorium tonight, the first of the second series of Steinert concerts. Seldom do music lovers have an opportunity of hearing a composer of such high rank set forth as pianist his own music in his own way. Both abroad and in this country he has given proof of remarkable technical powers and true virtuoso instinct for the piano. A master of the keyboard he has shown not less signal ability as an interpretative artist, playing with rare insight and imagination, eloquence and poetry. In particular these notable qualities shine through his own music which will make a part of his program, two

of his compositions being announced for the program tonight.

Besides his interpretations of his own compositions, Rachmaninoff is equally famous for his interpretations of Chopin's works. There are two of Chopin's compositions on tonight's program also. Bach, Mendelssohn, Liszt and Tschaikowsky are the other masters of composition that Rachmaninoff will interpret. The program follows:
