

Rachmaninoff to Give Excellent Program Here Thursday Evening

For the concert that he will give here Thursday evening in Crescent Temple, Sergei Rachmaninoff will give a program of great interest to lovers of music as well as to students. It will include two Chopin numbers, a work of Tchaikowsky, preludes by Scriabine, some of Rachmaninoff's own compositions and a Strauss-Tausig number.

The Chopin numbers will be "Fantasy" and the B-Flat Minor Sonata, with the three movements, largo, scherzo and finale. The Tchaikowsky selection will be "Variations" Opus 19, while Scriabine will be represented by "Nine Preludes."

The pianist will give his own Prelude C-Sharp Minor and a Bilet-Rachmaninoff "Minuet," and the pro-

gram will be concluded with the Strauss-Tausig "Valse."

There has been a great demand for seats for this concert by one of the most outstanding musicians of today. Rachmaninoff is both a conductor and a virtuoso. He is a Russian, and was born in Novogorod in 1873. When only 9 years old, he entered the Petrograd Conservatory, and in 1892 toured Russia as a pianist. A few years later he appeared in London as composer, orchestral conductor and pianist. His first American visit was made in 1909, and following his return to Russia he was appointed chief conductor of the Imperial Opera in Petrograd. His appearance here this year is one of the outstanding events of the Trenton Musical season.
