

## RACHMANINOFF IS HEARD BY HAMILTON

Through the management of the Stevenson-Hull concert course—Miss Cora Stevenson, and Miss Nell Hull—Hamilton was privileged to enjoy a rare treat Monday evening. Rachmaninoff, the noted Russian pianist, was heard at the high school auditorium by an audience which exceeded in enthusiasm anything ever seen in Hamilton. Rachmaninoff is an artist. He is interpretative and imaginative.

Personally, Rachmaninoff is impressive, but sombre. Full and stalwart, he impresses one immediately with his unusual dignity which he maintains throughout his program. But he is possessed of the soul of music and his interpretation of an exceptionally varied program, selected from Bach, Chopin, Tschalkowsky, Liszt and Strauss—Tausig, as well as two of his own compositions, gave wide range to his imagination and interpretation. His

coloring was the work of a master.

From almost the first note until the final encore, Rachmaninoff held his audience entranced.

There is but one regret and that is that Hamilton did not more generously support such a worthy effort upon the part of the Misses Stevenson and Hull. These young women have worked faithfully thru a series of years to give to Hamilton the best there is in art and music. At times it seemed that their efforts were appreciated—at other times it seemed that Hamilton lacked in the appreciation due such efforts. But whether appreciated or not, no one has done more to give Hamilton a place in the realm of art than have the Misses Stevenson and Hull.
