

# FAMOUS PIANIST ARRIVES HERE

Serge Rachmaninoff, Who  
Left Russia Because Life  
Became Unbearable, Ap-  
pears at Lyceum Tonight.

Serge Rachmaninoff, noted Russian pianist and composer, who will appear in concert at the Lyceum Theater this evening, arrived in this city this morning, reservations having been made for him at the Langwell Hotel. With him came Victor Spaulding of the Ellis Musical Bureau of Boston and John C. Paul of the Steinway Piano Company. Mr. Paul also acts as interpreter for Rachmaninoff, who cannot speak English.

The famous Russian was among the victims of the Bolshevik government of Russia, his property being confiscated and life made unbearable for him in his native country. He was permitted to leave Russia, and is in this country to give a brief concert tour.

The Steinway concert piano, which Rachmaninoff carries with him, will be placed on the Lyceum stage by the M. Doyle Marks Company, which also installed a Steinway at the hotel for the use of the musician.

A notable audience is expected to hear Rachmaninoff at the Lyceum this evening.
