

RACHMANINOFF PLAYS TODAY.

He Will Be Heard in Concert at 3 o'Clock at the Shubert.

Sergei Rachmaninoff, the Russian composer who appears in piano recital at 3 o'clock this afternoon at the Shubert Theater, is an impressive figure among the musicians of this day. Until three years ago, when he took refuge in the United States from the disorders in his own country, he was known only as a composer of "favorite" piano pieces, notably a prelude that all piano students played.

Since his arrival in New York, he has become the most sought after recitalist in the land, and his compositions have attracted wide attention. His musical setting of Poe's "The Bells" recently has been produced in New York and Philadelphia by orchestra and chorus. His symphonies and symphonic poems are on all orchestra programs. Without courting attention, Rachmaninoff has become the vogue. Following is the program he will play today:
