After Rachmaninoff's concert last season in Carnegie hall, Reginald de Koven wrote in the N. Y. Herald: "To judge from the continuous and spontaneous applause that greeted his entrance, followed every successive number, and culminated at the close of the concert in a kind of supplementary programme of encores quite after the old Paderewski fashion, I feel that I am not far wrong in stating that Sergei Rachmaninoff is one of the most popular composers and musicians of today, certainly with American concert goers. The audience, like myself, was evidently inclined to forget the great composer in the great pianist, for Rachmaninoff has a pianistic style and savor peculiarly his own, and as a piano virtuoso must surely today be accounted second to none. In either role, composer or pianist he fills me with practically undiluted artistic joy and satisfaction. The Rachmaninoff concert will begin promptly at 8:15 in the evening. The first number being a sonata, for the pleasure of those who are seated on time, other patrons arriving late will not be able to take their seats until after the entire sonata has been played.
