

## RACHMANINOFF THRILLS LARGE AUDIENCE HERE

Rachmaninoff, the famous Russian composer-pianist, delighted and thrilled a large audience at the Elmwood Music hall last night in a fascinatingly brilliant recital. His programme was selected with such remarkably good taste and judgment that the enthusiasm of the audience grew as the evening progressed. Equipped with fine natural taste, a deep sense of musical values and flawless technique Rachmaninoff's inspiring and satisfying playing places him at the very forefront of the world's greatest artists of the piano. His own compositions were distinguished features of an unusually excellent programme.

His first number, the A major sonata by Mozart, exemplified his technical skill and sympathetic reading. His encore "The Cuckoo," by Dauphin, emphasized his delicacy and piquancy of expression. Mr. Rachmaninoff's own compositions were Polichinelle, opus 3, and Baracolle, opus 10. His several other numbers were marked by that unsurpassable Rachmaninoff artistry to which all other pianists aspire.
